The meeting called to order at Sinclair Elementary School @ 7:05 PM with 53 dues paying members in attendance, with a quorum being present.

Speakers and Guests



Houston Police Department (HPD)— Cpl. Mark Leija representing HPD reviewed year to date crime statistics for the area. Burglary and theft were up for the year, but all other categories decreased. He spoke about the upcoming advent of "open carry" in Texas. The Department is working on policies to address the new law. Crime Prevention Tips included not leaving your garage door open and not posting vacation plans on public sites such as Facebook.

Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD) – Gary Bezemek, P.E., Project Coordinator and Erin P. Going, Property Manager

Mr. Bezemek had a PowerPoint presentation tailored to Timbergrove Manor reviewing the history of the District. He reviewed the "project process" including design, construction and maintenance for Flood Control. TMCC is in the White Oak Watershed. The alignment of the bayou has been changed over time, including straightening and the addition of concrete lining, as indicated by historical aerial photographs. Storm water detention was not required as part of the development approval process until 1990.

Parts of TMCC are within what is classified as a Shallow Floodplain. The speaker reviewed the probability of flooding for this event. In addition, another scenario for TMCC would be "ponding and overland flow" where the neighborhood may experience localized flooding, as a result of rainfall and topographical features.

Ms. Going spoke about the Buyout Program that was sponsored by FEMA in the area. Currently there are about 18 lots in the program, where owners volunteered to sell the properties, with 5 lots having maintenance agreements with HCFCD. The two (2) options are adopt a lot or landscape maintenance agreements. Currently the lots that do not have agreements are only mowed eight (8) times a year, with no maintenance to trees, fences or hedges.

Points of contact were given for maintenance issues and agreements:

There was a brief question and answer period including questions concerning whether: the FEMA lots could be sold, recent/chronic flooding in Hiddenlake Townhomes, maintenance of existing fences of the TMCC FEMA lots and overgrowth from two (2) of the FEMA lots, between Bryce and Shelterwood, that obstruct the sidewalks along West 11th Street.

HCFCD Representatives' Comments - Continued

- The speaker indicated that he did not have enough information about the acquisition of the lots and if there was a mechanism that would allow the lots to be sold and developed. This could be pursued further by contacting the speaker.
- 2. A number of neighbors from the Hiddenlake Townhomes stated their opinions concerning their area, which is adjacent to White Oak Bayou in "Old" Timbergrove Manor. The speaker invited the guests to speak with him after the meeting.
- 3. Concerning the wooden fence on West 11th Street, which is in a state of disrepair, HCFCD stated that they do not maintain fences or have a means to deal with downed trees unless they fall in the COH right-of-way. They did not have an answer. The resident explained the need for a barrier along West 11th Street.

Their presentation concluded at 8:15 PM.

Harris County Precinct 4 (HCP4) -Community Assistance Department - Ms. Stinsman

TMCC is located within the City of Houston and HCP4 does not maintain the roads, bridges and drainage in the area. The Precinct has a network of trails, greenways and parks, primarily in the northern portion of the County. The speaker reviewed the Precinct's Parks program and suggested that residents and TMCC contact her in the future for future inquiries and coordination with HCFCD.

Annual Elections-

FEMA Lots

- 1. Can the mowing cycles be adjusted to reflect the level of care that is the norm for the neighborhood? Including trimming the hedges along West 11th Street?
- 2. Can the derelict fences along West 11th Street be replaced or repaired so that they are not eyesores and do not a pose a danger to the public?
- 3. Can the lots be sold so that single family residences be constructed on them and returned to the tax rolls?
- 4. Who is the point of contact for HCFCD and their contact information so that they may be contacted by the Timbergrove Manor Civic Club (TMCC) when problems are reported?
