West 11th Street Park

We are still working with our project manager at Houston Parks Board to get an up-to-date estimate for constructing the trail segment running from the kiosk on Shelterwood back to the loop trail in the interior of the park. There was a change of directors recently at HPB and a subsequent shakeup in how things are done. As of yesterday, I have been working on a new application form for the project—none was required before as the trail work was viewed as a "continuation project."

The 3rd annual "Run the Grove" 5K fun run and Spring Fling festival were held on April 22 and were a great success. On April 23, Friends of West 11th Street Park hosted a Daisy girl troop who came out to plant wildflowers in one of our beds and to take a mini-tour of the park interior.

Bryce Street Trailhead Park

The park appears to be nearing completion, with some sod work remaining to be done. I spoke with Sherry Weesner, the TIRZ 5 representative on the project last night, and she reported that negotiations are continuing regarding improper foundations that were installed by the initial contractor under the new fence surrounding the chemical treatment station. Apparently that needs to be resolved before they move ahead with finalizing the landscaping. I emphasized to her that there was some neighborhood concern about the current poor cosmetic appearance of the park, and asked if an interim solution might be found for that. In the meantime, Hike & Bike trail users have discovered the park and are using it on a regular basis.

Questions for MPT Cohen - TMCC May 9, 2017 General Meeting

1) Reference email 7-20-16 from Traci Elsner to Darlene Wayt saying that the rusted utility cabinet at the back or east-side of Jaycee Park will be considered for the mini-mural program. Was it considered? What is the answer about turning this eye-sore into a mini-mural? Or improve the look of it in some way? Or find out from PWE or HPARD if it still serves a purpose and, if not, remove it from the park?



- 2) Thank you for allocating funds for the Timbergrove/Holly Park traffic study. Please give us an update? Where are we in the process? When will the COH make public their recommendations and when will a public comment period be scheduled?
- 3) Texting while driving on Ella Blvd. in front of Sinclair Elementary School is a dangerous problem in our area as it is for all of Houston. The COH has done nothing to ban texting while driving not city-wide and not even in school zones.

Regarding school zones, HB 55 has been state law *for 8 years* and nearby cities like Bellaire installed the signs years ago in school zones to enforce this law but not the COH. Why? What's your opinion of HB 512 currently making its way through the State Legislature?

Regarding a city-wide ordinance, Sugar Land is the latest city to join about 100 other Texas cities including Galveston, Missouri City and West University Place that have enacted city ordinances that ban texting while driving, but not the COH. Why? If HB62/SB31 fail yet again to ban texting while driving state-wide, will the COH and Council take action to ban texting while driving?

- 4) Regarding the Bryce Chemical Feed Station Rebuild, a final walk-through has been scheduled and then postponed several times, last time being late February; the last update given by Joe Hanak, PWE Project Manager, was 3-21-17 when he reported that "scope was being developed for adding remote sensors," and that he would let us know when a plan was set and that a final walk-through would take place after that. What are the outstanding issues at this site? When are all issues expected to be resolved? When will a final inspection/walk-through take place?
- 5) Damaged Sidewalks -It is our understanding that the homeowner is responsible for the maintenance/repair of the sidewalks in front of their houses. There are a number of sections of sidewalks in our neighborhoods that have been damaged or have settled as the direct result leaks, repairs or maintenance of underlying COH utilities. What plans

- does the City have to repair these walking hazards? Does the TMCC need to provide the City with a list and location of these hazards?
- 6) Traffic Signs A majority of the street signs in the neighborhood, especially along the major thoroughfares do not meet current COH or TxMUTCD standards, as the size of the signs are too small or the sign do not reflect light, which visually impairs drivers or emergency responders. Does the City have any plans to replace the deficient signs and provide additional signs and paving markings to assist drivers and first responders?
- 7) Missing Sidewalk on West T.C. Jester There is an approximate 200' gap in the existing sidewalk along West T.C. Jester, on the east side of the major thoroughfare (1400 Block) serving T.C. Jester Park. Would it be possible, if TMCC provided engineered drawings for a proposed sidewalk extension, that the City of Houston could waive their plan review/permitting fees to allow the Civic Club to hire a contractor to install the much needed sidewalk?

Crime Info (also published in May Timbergram

- Timbergrove Manor Sections 5-14 have averaged 12 reported crimes per year from January through March, for years 2013 to 2016. We are seeing a slight downward trend with a count of 8 reported crimes for the same months in 2016 and 10 for those months in 2017. 6 of the 10 crimes in 2017 were reported in February which is an abnormally high number of crimes reported for one month.\
- Theft typically dominates that crime count in the 45-65% range while burglary is second in the range of 30-40%. 2016 year-end had burglary incidents dropping into the range of 25% and 2017 January through March shows burglary in the 20% range. We continue to adapt the SEALS private security schedules based on reported crimes, available funding and your feedback.

The latest edition of the Timbergram will also be available on the TMCC website (timbergrove.org) beginning May 1st.




